FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **State Technical College of Missouri** and the **University of Central Missouri** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **University of Missouri System** have reviewed this proposed legislation and have determined there would be no to minimal fiscal impact on the University of Missouri. The University would already be assessing non-resident or international rates if we had these students so there would be no change to the University's financials for this new language.

Oversight notes that the responding entities have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other colleges and universities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act prohibits public institutions of higher education from offering in-state tuition to any student unlawfully present in the United States. Such education institutions shall verify that students receiving in-state tuition are United States citizens, permanent residents, or lawfully present in the United States.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
