FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Sections 334.702 - 334.726 - Athletic Trainer Provisions

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance (DCI)** assume this bill is anticipated to have no fiscal impact to DCI. However, should the extent of the work be more than anticipated, the department would request additional appropriation and/or FTE through the budget process.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agency has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

For the purpose of the proposed legislation, and as a result of excessive caseloads, the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** state that they cannot assume existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any indigent clients faced with the enhanced penalties for acting as an Athletic Trainer and violating the provision of 334.700 to 334.725 - a new class B misdemeanor. The Missouri State Public Defender System is currently providing legal representation in caseloads in excess of recognized standards.

In Fiscal Year 2018 and in Fiscal Year 2019- MSPD's Trial Division did not open any cases under charge code 334.725.

While the number of new cases may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the Office of the State Public Defender will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

Oversight notes there were no misdemeanor charges filed under §334.725 in fiscal years '17, '18 or '19 and assumes the SPD would not be materially impacted by the changes in this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assumed many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could require additional resources.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** state this legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Oversight assumes JCAR will be able to administer any rules resulting from this proposal with existing resources.

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Revenue, the Office of the State Treasurer, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol and the Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
