FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Revenue**, **Office of the Attorney General**, **Office of State Courts Administrator**, and **Office of Administration** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

In response to a request for fiscal impact for a similar proposal, HB 1596 (2020), the **Department of Commerce and Insurance** assumed no fiscal impact.

In their response to a fiscal impact request for similar language in Perfected HB 186 (2019), the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** said that the state had not received any settlements or judgments for claims where the product was 15 years or older.

Because of the consistency of responses and lack of contrary information, **Oversight** shows \$0 direct fiscal impact to State and Local agencies.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This legislation places a 15 year statute of limitations on damage claims for economic loss, personal injury, property damage or wrongful death arising out of a defective or unsafe condition of products sold or leased. It has exceptions for products with warranties, and specifies that defendants can introduce certain evidence.

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
