#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the State Tax Commission, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Public Safety (Missouri Veterans Commission, Missouri State Emergency Management Agency, Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Division of Fire Safety, Missouri National Guard, Capitol Police, Office of the Director & the Missouri Highway Patrol), Department of Economic Development, Department of Corrections, Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, Department of Social Services, Office of Administration, Department of Transportation, Department of Mental Health, Missouri House of Representatives, Missouri Senate, Office of the State Auditor, Office of Prosecution Services, Department of Commerce and Insurance, Missouri Department of Conservation, MoDOT & Patrol Employees' Retirement System, Legislative Research, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Missouri Lottery Commission, Office of the Attorney General, Office of the State Courts Administrator, Office of the State Treasurer, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Office of the Governor, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Revenue, Office of the State Public Defender, Missouri Gaming Commission, Administrative Hearing Commission, and the Missouri **Ethics Commission** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

**Oversight** notes the numerous agencies listed above have stated that Senate Revision Bill 796 would not have a fiscal impact on their respective agencies. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

According to officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)**, many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of

regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could require additional resources.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** state this legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

**Oversight** assumes JCAR will be able to administer any rules resulting from this proposal with existing resources.
