FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 324.009 - Professional License Reciprocity

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** (**DHSS**) assumed the proposed legislation revises the professional licensing reciprocity criteria necessary to qualify for a license in the state of Missouri. Applicants applying for licensure under the proposed legislation would fall under the same reciprocity process, fee, and review as current applicants. Changing regulations and applicant licensure reviews are within the normal ebb and flow for the Division of Regulation and Licensure so minimal time and expense will be required to conduct the requirements of the proposed legislation.

The department anticipates being able to absorb these costs. However, until the FY21 budget is final, the department cannot identify specific funding sources.

Oversight notes that the DHSS has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance** (**DCI**) stated this bill is anticipated to have no fiscal impact to the department. However, should the extent of the work be more than anticipated, the department would request additional appropriation and/or FTE through the budget process.

Oversight notes that the DCI has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue**, the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Department of Transportation** and the **Department of Public Safety** - **Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
