ASSUMPTION

§§191.1720 - "Missouri Save Adolescents from Experimentation (SAFE) Act" and gender transition procedures

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 2649), officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assumed any additional litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing personnel and resources. However, the AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Public Safety, Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan**, the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, the **Missouri Department of Transportation**, the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services**, the **Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission**, the **Office of the State Public Defender**, the **City of Kansas City** and **O'Fallon** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services** defer to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 2649), officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Hermann Area Hospital District**, the **City of Springfield** and the **St. Louis Budget Division** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, county commissioners and hospitals were requested to respond to this

proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System database is available upon request.

Small business health care providers could, under circumstance outlined in the proposal, be subject to administrative discipline or taken to court as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
