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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§435.300, 435.303, 435.306, 435.309 & 435.312 – Alternative Dispute Resolution

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes MODOT responded to similar legislation in 2022, HB 2660, as follows:

Officials from MoDOT assumed the proposal will have an unknown positive impact of \$0 to less than \$100,000 per year to the State Road Fund as the Fund could benefit from mandatory arbitration from tort claims. Oversight has inquired with MoDOT regarding the difference in responses.

Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note. Therefore, Oversight will reflect MODOT's response from the prior year for this fiscal note.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Office of Administration and the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective

organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.
