# **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume the following regarding this proposal:

#### <u>§302.768.3</u>

The proposed legislation allows applicants to submit a medical examiners certificate and accompanying variance or waivers in person, or by mail, facsimile or electronic mail.

To reduce overlapping system development, due to the pending implementation of a modernized system and a pending fully automated interface with the Federal medical certificate registry once available, the Department assumes the electronically submitted documents allowed per this proposed change will be updated manually through currently available system options.

### Administrative Impact

To implement the proposed legislation, the Department would be required to:

• Update interactive applications for automated responses to customers through telephone system (current vendor Genesys) or online (DORA);

- Update website,
- Update policies and procedures,
- Modify certification form;
- Develop correspondence;
- Train staff.

Based on the estimated number of certificate submissions, estimated number that may be manually entered, and related correspondence processing, DLB assumes an additional <u>3 FTE</u> would be required to implement these provisions. Since the assumed solution is a manual submission and entry process, if the handling of the incoming fax and email documents and the increased work to image and store the updated certifications cannot be managed within the Federal mandated compliance timeframes, the Department may be required to request appropriations for additional staff for document management and correspondence beyond just data entry as used for the calculations below.

- 25 medical certificates processed per hour per employee
- $\underline{X 6}$  processing hours per day
- 150 average certificates processed per day per employee
- X 252 working days a year
- 37,800 average certificates that may be processed annually per employee

60,593 Estimated number of medical certificates submitted electronically (assuming 75% rate of 80,790 (FY 2022)) since some may still go to the office.

Estimate = an additional 1.6 FTE

Additionally, each application will result in increased correspondence which will be required to confirm updates, notify of ineligibility, notify of incomplete information or to refer applicants to a local office when a modification to the actual commercial document is required, which will be typically the same rate of processing.

Estimate = an additional 1.6 FTE for correspondence handling.

The Department estimates at least 3 FTE will be required to manage electronic submission in the current environment.

\$33,696 annual salary for associate customer service rep. X 3 FTE \$101,088 Total annual salary 3 FTE

**Oversight** does not have information to the contrary and therefore, Oversight will reflect the costs of three additional FTE for DOR.

## Revenue Impact

**DOR** assumes it may collect the electronic transmission fee allowed for under §136.055.

Due to the federal compliance timelines, staffing will be imperative to ensure that all medical certificates are updated to the driver record within 10 days of issuance or as submitted by the driver until a fully electronic solution with updates directly from FMCSA is available that will ensure timely processing. Failure to update commercial records timely may result in a compliance finding and may be subject to withholding of federal-aid highway funding as prescribed under 49 CFR\$ 384.401.

**Oversight** assumes DOR will be in compliance with federal mandates; therefore, Oversight will not reflect a potential loss of federal funding on the fiscal note.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation** defer to DOR for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

Officials from the **Missouri Highway Patrol** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for that agency.

# FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business
