ASSUMPTION

Repeals §§ 188.017, 188.026, 188.056, 188.057, 188.058, and 188.375 – Provisions relating to abortion

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office**, the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning**, the **Department of Commerce and Insurance**, the **Department of Economic Development**, the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**, the **Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Department of Corrections**, the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, the **Department of Revenue**, the **Department of Public Safety Divisions of: Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Capitol Police, Fire Safety, Director's Office, Gaming Commission, Missouri National Guard, Veterans Commission** and the **State Emergency Management Agency**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Missouri Department of Agriculture**, the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, the **Missouri Ethics Commission**, the **Missouri Department of Transportation**, the **Office of Administration**, the **Office of the State Public Defender**, the **City of Kansas City**, the **City of Springfield**, the **Newton County Health Department**, the **St. Louis County Health Department**, the **Phelps County Sheriff's Department**, the **Kansas City Police Department**, the **St. Joseph Police Department**, the **St. Louis County Police Department**, the **University of Central Missouri**, **St. Charles Community College**, the **Office of the Governor**, the **Office of the Lieutenant Governor**, the **Office of the State Auditor**, the **Missouri House of Representatives**, the **Missouri Senate**, the **Missouri Lottery**, the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan**, the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety, Missouri Highway Patrol** defer to the MoDOT/MHP Health Care Board for response relating to the fiscal impact of this proposal on their organization.

Rule Promulgation

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain

amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.


