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### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

§67.142 – Regulation of Breed-Specific Dogs

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Agriculture** and the **City of Kansas City** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **City of Springfield** anticipate a negative fiscal impact of approximately \$20,000 annually due to a loss of pit bull registration fees.

**Oversight** notes Missouri's annual registration fees for dangerous dogs can range from \$50 to \$125 depending on which city you live in, while other states' fees are as much as \$500 per year. Oversight researched 16 cities regarding their ordinances for dangerous dogs based on specific breeds. Certain regulations are required for cities with "dangerous dog" ordinances in order to keep dogs within the city limits. Such regulations include muzzling the dog, additional liability insurance required by the owner, dog being kept in a pin or inside the house, and/or potential higher registration fees.

Oversight notes that according to certain cities, a lot of the ordinances that did have regulations either did not require additional fees, classification for "dangerous dogs" are for all breeds or not many registrations were processed regarding dangerous dogs. While some local political subdivisions may experience a reduction in fees collected based on the passage of this legislation, Oversight assumes the impact would be less than \$100,000 per year. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a negative fiscal impact that is \$0 to less than \$100,000 to local political subdivisions for this section of the proposal.

§§340.341, 340.345, 340.381, 340.384 & 340.387 – Dr. Merrill Townley and Dr. Dan Brown Large Animal Veterinary Student Loan Program

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Agriculture (MDA)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. MDA notes six (6) students have been awarded \$20,000 each (per academic year) for the past three years.

**Oversight** notes this proposal increases the number of students awarded from six to 12 per academic year. In addition, the proposal increases the amount of award from \$20,000 per academic year to \$30,000 per academic year, not to exceed \$120,000 total (per student). Oversight assumes MDA may award the maximum number of students allowed; therefore, Oversight will reflect an increased cost to MDA of \$240,000 ((6 new x \$30,000) + (6 existing x (\$30,000 - \$20,000)) per year.

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Oversight notes this proposal allows MDA to award more than 12 applicants if additional moneys from private grants, gifts, donations, devises, or bequests of moneys, funds, real or personal property, or other assets are deposited in the Veterinary Student Loan Payment Fund; therefore, Oversight will reflect the increase as "Could exceed \$240,000".

Oversight notes there was a \$28 balance in the Veterinary Student Loan Payment Fund (0803) as of April 30, 2023.

Oversight notes actual expenditures for this program over the past three years have been:

Oversight notes this program has a transfer from the Lottery Proceeds Fund to fund the program. With the small balance of the Veterinary Student Loan Payment Fund, Oversight will assume the additional proceeds needed for a program expansion will be transferred in from the Lottery Proceeds Fund (0291).
