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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§193.175, 194.010, 194.105, and 194.119 - Disposition of the dead

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** state §194.010 of this proposed legislation repeals provisions of law relating to the transportation of dead bodies and authorizes the Department of Health and Senior Services to issue regulations governing such transportation on common carriers in Missouri. The DHSS is charged with promulgating rules regarding the transportation of dead human bodies placed on common carriers in the state of Missouri. It is expected that rule promulgation would take approximately 100 hours for an Environmental Program Supervisor at a salary of \$71,846 (as of March 2023) at a cost of \$3,454.

It is assumed the Department can absorb the costs of this bill with current resources. However, if the workload significantly increased or other legislation was enacted, additional resources would be requested through the appropriation process.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Oversight assumes the DHSS has sufficient staff and resources available to absorb the additional work of drafting rules and will not reflect a fiscal impact for the DHSS.

Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Kansas City Health Department, the Newton County Health Department, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services and the Office of the State Courts Administrator each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **St. Louis County Health Department** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local public health agencies and coroners were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.
