FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 393.1030 – Renewable Energy Standard

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance - Public Service Commission (PSC)** state this proposal may require a rulemaking by the PSC in order to implement the provisions. Rulemakings generally result in an estimated cost of up to approximately \$4,700.

PSC is funded by an assessment on Commission-regulated public utilities pursuant to Section 386.370, RSMo, and not by any state general appropriations. Depending on the cumulative effect of all PSC-impacting legislation passed in the current session and the associated increased costs associated with that legislation to the PSC, the PSC may need to request an increase in our appropriation authority and/or FTE allocation as appropriate through the budget process.

Oversight assumes PSC could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, PSC could request funding through the assessment process. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
