# FISCAL ANALYSIS 

## ASSUMPTION

## Section 161.854 - Parental Consent Procedures

Officials from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) state they would be required to develop and have translated documents for school districts to use with parents. DESE assumes translation of documents would be approximately $\$ 1,000$ per language with an estimated 35 languages required. This would total $\$ 35,000$. DESE is requesting these funds annually as any changes/updates to forms would require translation.

Upon further inquiry, DESE stated the Office of Special Education with DESE already provides for the publication of a document called the Procedural Safeguards, which must be provided to all families of children with disabilities served in public and charter schools under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. They currently translate that document into 35 different languages based on constituents' needs in Missouri. When looking at the cost per document for translation of those languages most recently translated, the range was anywhere from $\$ 200$ to nearly $\$ 1,000$ each based on the availability of a translator for that language and the contractor to provide the translation. Oversight has no way to determine how many documents will need to be translated or into how many languages. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a cost of up to DESE's $\$ 35,000$ estimate.

In response to a similar proposal, HB 1163 (2023), DESE also stated there could potentially be hearing costs. DESE would not expect more than 5-10 hearings in a year. The cost for hearings was estimated at $\$ 5,665$.

Oversight notes that DESE has stated the estimated cost for hearings can be absorbed with existing resources.

Oversight assumes there could be costs for school districts to implement parental consent procedures in this proposal.

Oversight did not receive any responses from school districts related to the fiscal impact of this proposal. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information available. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, school districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

## FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act requires public schools that serve students with an individualized education program (IEP) to obtain written parental consent for placements, removals, additions, changes, or reductions of services in the IEPs of such students. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education shall adopt a parental consent form for use by local educational agencies. The act outlines the information to be included on the form, including a statement that the parent has the right to consent or refuse to consent to the actions described in the act.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
