#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

### Section 161.390 Classical Education Grant

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume the creation of the "Classical Education Grant Program" would require the development of the grant application, review of applicants, technical assistance with implementation, and follow up regarding efficacious use of funds, including annual budget reporting. Depending upon the final scope and funds allocated toward the grant, DESE is estimating that the work would extend beyond the current staff capacity at the equivalence of 0.25 FTE of a Director level salary (midlevel, \$74,808) plus related expenses and equipment.

The total grant program to be disbursed would be dependent upon appropriation of General Revenue transferred into the new fund. DESE has reflected a cost of \$0 to Unknown as the grant amounts or total appropriation is not described. However, assuming grants ranged in requests from \$1,000 - \$50,000 per local education agency (LEA) and approximately 200 LEAs applied the cost could be between \$200,000 and \$10,000,000.

**Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect the unknown fiscal impact by described DESE in the fiscal note.

**Oversight** is uncertain how much would be appropriated and transferred into the Classical Education Grant Program Fund, if any, but notes per DESE grants ranged in requests from \$1,000 - \$50,000 per local education agency (LEA) and approximately 200 LEAs applied the cost could be between \$200,000 and \$10,000,000. Therefore, Oversight assumes the transfer from General Revenue could exceed the \$250,000 threshold.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal creates the Classical Education Grant Program Fund. For simplicity, Oversight assumes all funds will be utilized in the year in each they were received.

Officials from the **Office of the State Treasurer (STO)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this agency.

**Oversight** did not receive any responses from school districts related to the fiscal impact of this proposal. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information available. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note. **Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, school districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

## **Rule Promulgation**

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

# FISCAL DESCRIPTION

L.R. No. 4914S.01I Bill No. SB 1290 Page **6** of **6** March 25, 2024

Subject to appropriation, this act establishes the "Classical Education Grant Program" and corresponding fund in the state treasury for the purpose of assisting school districts with providing programs in classical education. The act defines a "classical education program" as a program that educates students in the liberal arts and sciences. The liberal arts consist of certain language and mathematical skills, while the sciences consist of bodies of knowledge including the human sciences, the natural sciences, and the theological sciences, as such terms are described in the act. A school district that wishes to receive a grant shall submit an application to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education outlining the proposed classical educational program, establishing key success metrics, identifying resources available in the community, and specifying additional resources necessary for successful implementation of the program.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
