FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Attorney General's Office, the Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission, the Department of Corrections, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri Department of Transportation - Patrol Employees' Retirement System, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Northwest Missouri State University, the University of Central Missouri, and the City of Kansas City each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for the DOLIR.

Oversight notes that currently, under §287.200.3.(2) payment is suspended for someone who is restored to his or her regular work, or equivalent.

Upon further inquiry, **Oversight** notes that OA assumed this proposal would not have an impact difference from what is currently happening today.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** defer to the OA for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

Rule Promulgation

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
