FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§300.295 & 304.035 – Railroad Crossings

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation** and **Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to similar legislation, SB 254 (2025), officials from the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services** assumed the proposal would not have a fiscal impact.

In response to similar legislation, HB 2636 (2024), officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that the above-mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Oversight notes the following Misdemeanor guilty dispositions for §304.035 over the past few years based upon information provided by the Office of the State Courts Administrator:
