FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§313.205 & 313.230 – State Lottery

Officials from the **Missouri Lottery Commission (MLC)** state they are unable to estimate the revenue a \$5 lottery game based on the outcome of sporting events would generate given the more sophisticated sports betting products available in the state. The impact of this proposal is unknown.

Oversight notes, upon further inquiry, MLC does not anticipate any costs associated with a \$5 game based on the outcome of a sporting event or for an internet application to sell lottery tickets through a personal device. MLC states they typically pay lottery game vendors on a percentage-of-sales basis and do not pay upfront costs at the beginning of a game or for the implementation of a distribution channel.

Oversight assumes an increase in lottery revenues (exceeding the \$250,000 threshold) with the addition of sports-outcome-based lottery games, online and electric ticket sales, and expanded player access via personal devices. Therefore, Oversight will reflect an “Unknown” revenue gain to the State Lottery Fund (1682).

Oversight notes there was a balance of \$20,512,424 in the State Lottery Fund (1682) as of December 31, 2025.

Officials from the **Missouri Gaming Commission** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this agency.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact on small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Current law prohibits the state lottery from approving any lottery game based on the outcome of sporting events. This act repeals such prohibition, provided that the maximum ticket price shall not exceed five dollars per ticket.

Additionally, the act authorizes the Lottery Commission to use an internet application to sell electronic scratcher games, draw games, and pull-tab games where a player may access such application using a personal device.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
