ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources** assumes this proposal would have no fiscal impact upon their department.

DESCRIPTION


This act authorizes Jefferson County to enact ordinances to provide for the abatement of debris on any lot or land. Jefferson County may enact an ordinance, which provides that if the owner does not remove the nuisance within seven days of receiving notice of the nuisance. The building commissioner or designated office may have the condition removed and the cost of such removal may be included in a special tax bill or added to the annual real estate bill for the property.

DESCRIPTION (continued)

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
